In a warm, dry summer only one game was lost to rain, though disappointingly three were pulled through lack of numbers. There were four new opponents: Actonians, Canary Wharf, Long Ditton and, the only one scheduled pre-season, Sheen Park. Gents renewed acquaintance with none of the six sides who entered the fixture list for the first time in 2024.

So the club's 38th season was not without its challenges but it was a winning one, and this should be celebrated. Full sides were fielded in 18 of the 19 games, so credit is due to the team secretary and the new Play-cricket selection process he put in place. Other administrative aspects were sound, with generally true pitches, though the quality at Wycombe House fell off, a problem suitably addressed by their cricket committee. There was a good atmosphere in the games and instances of conflict were few.

Thirty-two men played including 12 debutants. Arikatla, Chatharaju, Krishna, Parvathaneni and Sudireddy were seen less, the slack being taken up by Chowdhary, the returning Inkollu, the Ahmed brothers and Zahid's son Sufyan, Miglani and de Watteville. Three Patels (ever-present Hemin, Raj and Sanjay) played more than 15 times.

The teams were well led and often played very good cricket. Only Crossbats, Merton Hawks, Northfields and Millfields dismissed the Gents who lost on average only 5.7 wickets per innings, the fewest ever (previously 6.2 in 2000). The campaign began hesitantly with four losses out of six. In this period, Merton Hawks became the sole opponent to score 200 against the Gents while Putney won for the first time after five defeats in the rubber, and deserved it too. The arrival of warmer weather saw fortunes turn round. Gents were confident and sometimes sparkling in winning 11 successive matches between 1 June and 17 August. Sheen Park was the performance of the year, their captain kind enough to state that that the Gents would be competitive in their first XI's Surrey Saturday league. Millfields stopped the winning run on a spicy Wycombe House track before John Buckner XI were beaten, rain preventing a start in the final game against Salix, the only such cancellation of the year. There were 14 wins and five defeats.

Gents batted second 12 times and won 10, four times being asked to chase scores of 150 or under which reflected well upon a rounded, competent attack. It was unlikely therefore to have been a prolific season for batsmen. After being outscored by Gulati in 2024, Kota climbed back to the top of the tree with two hundreds and three fifties. It is worth noting that only two batsmen have ever exceeded his 598 runs, which stands at No.7 in the all-time aggregates. Z. Ahmed, Gulati, Parvathaneni and Puli each notched a fifty. Skipper R. Patel scored a personal best 266 runs, one ahead of the very consistent Puli. He and his vice often rotated batting orders to maximise involvement.

The bowling statistics, with one exception, look unspectacular but they mask what was a series of disciplined, consistent performances. H. Patel spun his way to 31 wickets in 104.5 overs, his best since 2010, to continue to close in on S. Patel's aggregate. Dubey (17 wickets) had his best bowling season and with Gulati, S. Patel and Inkollu gave the captain control. The economy figures were impressive: of the nine bowlers who sent down 20 or more overs, three (Chowdhary, Gulati and S. Patel) paid under four runs per over, and five (Chatharaju, Dubey, H. Patel, Inkollu, Krishna and Puli) under four. Dubey and regular guest Kulasingam took five wickets in an innings, Dubey and H. Patel four.

R. Patel bowled only 16.3 overs before taking over the gloves from Sudireddy, who had moved up to the Midlands. He kept solidly, dismissing 14 batsmen. The ground-fielding was up to the mark, particularly on familiar home turf. Only 70 fielding dismissals were taken, compared to 103 in the exceptional 2024 season when four more matches were played. Some of the catches were remarkable, Kota, Puli and S. Patel providing lasting memories of athleticism.

We conclude by paying respectful tribute to the memory of former players Steve Bignell, who died in December, and Frank Gallagher. May they rest in peace.



AGM repercussions

With a quorum of 10, it was touch and go whether or not the 2025 AGM could go ahead at all. In the event only 11 attended, with several members failing to offer apologies for absence or submit votes for the awards, which shows a certain lack of interest in club affairs.

There was a motion, perhaps vaguely worded and passed 6-5 in a tense atmosphere, that the Gents should open discussions with Northfields CC with a view to a possible merger, which caused the temporary resignation of a committee member. Discussions duly took place but foundered, so the merger will not be proceeding. Northfield's committee then seems to have had a blood transfusion, a healthy fixture list and renewed commitment the result. Ambassadors report no hard feelings on either side and we'll see them in May.

Nets season, optimistically defined as January to March, then collapsed around our ears with no sessions taking place. This was no way to welcome prospective members or encourage current ones.

Gents will rise to the challenges of 2026 with an enhanced, much changed squad. S. Ahmed, Z. Ahmed and G. Arikatla were proposed, seconded and elected as members at the AGM. Wicket-keeper/batsman Zohaib Chaudri, leg-spinner Hashim Malik and fast bowling all-rounder Adnaan Osman have since been recruited. Fine chaps, all. It is better to recruit this way than by open advertisements which have never proved successful.

We led with a photo of Nilesh Dubey for a very good reason. The efficient process he has established for early selection and announcement of teams worked well in 2025 in the face of frequent obstacles caused by changing availability. We all benefit from his good works, every week, and he should be applauded.

Annual subscriptions

These are now due at £70 for adults and £35 for juniors. Gents made a profit of £52 in 2025, not bad given the cancellations.

We commend the fixture list to you. Five games will be at Wycombe House: 14.6 and 13.9 were also offered but too late to change the Salix venues. LB Merton have done much work to improve the pitches and increased the prices accordingly from £118.25 to £149.05 (Wycombe House is £250). They have also installed proper facilities at Haydons Road RG.

So far, so good, but whom will we play there? Empire are new, John Buckner XI are increased from 1 to 2 and Chaddleworth, Phoenix and Long Ditton reinstated after cancellations. Otherwise it's Northfields 2 to 1, and Canary Wharf, Actonians, St Anne's Allstars and Wycombe House 0 to 1 (House might be reinstated depending on their calendar, let's hope so).

Remember the first game will be on an artificial wicket so no spikes please. The ground authority English Heritage is very strict on this. Byfleet follows (friend of the secretary Stuart West will umpire) before we get chances to test the improved facilities at Dundonald RG against Merton Hawks and Putney.

Other ramblings

We offer apologies for the delay in issuing *Gent 183*. The advent of Play-cricket has meant that it is no longer necessary to reproduce scorecards and match reports, the creation of which has been shared around, have been available on the website by the Monday or Tuesday. We believe however that it is necessary to have an end-of-season summary and analysis of the matters facing us.

Not much changed in the club records. Kota shot up five places to tenth in the appearances list, overtaking Ashton in the process (154 to 153). Gulati rose two places to seventh in the runs aggregates. Puli became the latest batsman to score 1,000 runs. With 461 wickets, H. Patel is only 17 behind S. Patel (478, which is equal to his total matches played). Gulati needs only five wickets for his 100. It has been asked if the two hundred-run stands against St. Anne's Allstars (in which about a thousand batsmen participated due to the agreed retirement rule) was unique. It was not. There have been three instances.

In the first 37 seasons, Gents cancelled only five times through lack of numbers compared to 13 times by opponents. In 2025, Gents failed to raise teams to play Fighting Stars, Chaddleworth and Plastics resulting in three blank Sundays. Though the sample size is small, this was an unwelcome development, though sadly one not restricted to the Gents. Salix lost six games in 2025, Northfields five. Many village teams have also folded in recent years.
